Greetings Westwood Heights Community,

I am excited to be starting this year as the Superintendent of Westwood Heights. I am ready to collaborate and learn with the students, parents, and families that make up this wonderful community. It is an honor to be part of a faculty and staff committed to providing the best possible education for every student in a safe, nurturing environment.

I believe the partnership between our families and our school district is an important part of our success. Students benefit as parents and guardians are involved in their learning. It is our goal to have consistent communication between home and school and regular opportunities for families to learn about what is happening here in Westwood Heights.

I am passionate about helping every child become a life-long learner, and I believe that this is the season of discovery. We are working diligently to provide different avenues for our students to explore. I want to stress that safety is the number one concern in our district. In light of what is going on in the world, it will be of the upmost importance to report any situation that might put our students in danger. I'm asking the community to help us with this process. When it comes to COVID, we want to follow the guidelines set by the Genesee County Health Department. The administration and health staff appreciated your efforts to help stop the spread in each building.

There will be a change this fall when we open up. We will be moving the 1st grade programs to Hamady Elementary. In addition to that, the district will continue with our CTE Program teaching construction and trades. We will also be adding multimedia classes in the district this year. These programs provide an alternative route to success for our students. As always, our alternative programs will be open for any student in Genesee County. Academy West will continue to graduate students who need a different path to graduation, and our adult education program is considered the top program in the county and one of the premier programs in the state.

The process of educating and caring for our children is a team effort. I encourage you to contact the school at any time if you have a concern, need clarification, or simply want to check in with your child's educators. We are also asking that you guide and support your students' learning by ensuring that they:

- 1. Attend school daily and arrive on time, ready for the day's school experience.
- 2. Complete all homework assignments given by teachers.
- 3. Share their school experiences with you so that you are aware of their school life.
- 4. Know that you expect them to succeed in school and become a successful citizen who is prepared for college and career. This starts with knowing how to behave in an educational setting.
- 5. Demonstrate respect towards peers, teachers, staff and self.
- 6. Work hard to self-advocate, plan and achieve.

The administrative team is always available to meet and discuss school issues or the individual progress of any student with parents, guardians, and the students themselves. Additionally, the excellent counselors, social workers, student support assistants, and other support staff are available to assist in supporting our students.

To make the school year the best for you and your student, please support the district in any way you can. June 27-30, 2022, Middle School Science teachers, Mr. Hayat and Mrs. Wylie, attended a Placed Based Education Conference at For-mar Nature Preserve sponsored by the Great Lakes Stewardship Initiative and Genesee County Parks. Teachers from across Genesee and Lapeer Counties learned how student voice and participation helps create impactful opportunities for students as they become environmental stewards of our community and ecosystems.

Teachers were trained in how Place Based Education (PBE) works in any classroom to invite student voice and make impacts in communities while creating hands on experiences to create knowledge and change.

I currently reside in Saginaw with my fiancé, two cats, and a dog. I am a facilitator for a local non-profit called Self Love Beauty and love reading and volunteering in my down time.



My name is Rhonda Myers. I am the Special Education Teacher Consultant for the district. I came to the district in January of last school year, working primarily at Hamady Elementary and Academy West. This year, my duties will have me primarily working at Academy West and McMonagle Elementary. I offer extra services (mostly in the general education setting) to students with IEPs. I am originally from Michigan, but I moved to Arizona to attend college and ended up staying

there for 30 years. Two years ago, I decided it was time to come home to Michigan. I'm excited to begin the school year with WWH!

Last year, my dad also decided to move back to Michigan, and he now lives with me and my fiance. I also have two wonderful children: my daughter is 27 and lives in Chicago, and my son is 24 and lives in Arizona.

What is Child Find?

Child Find is a program of active outreach by the Michigan Department of Education, Genesee Intermediate School District, and local school districts. Child Find specifically requires the district to identify, locate, and evaluate all children with disabilities, birth through age twentyfive. Child Find includes children who are homeless, wards of the state, migrant children, and those that attend private schools.

How Does Child Find Work?

The primary purpose is to identify children who have a disability that affects his or her progress in the general education curriculum (for preschool-age children that affects involvement in age-level activities). This information is used to determine if the student is eligible for appropriate special education programs and services to address the unique needs of the student that result from the disability. Genesee Intermediate School District, along with the 21 local school districts and the 13 public school academies, have a legal responsibility to provide a free and appropriate public education for all students with disabilities who reside within our districts.

Who can begin the Child Find process?

Any parent, physician, agency, or individual may refer a child to Child Find by written request to or by contacting the Special Education Director, and requesting an evaluation.



Section 504 Plans

Section 504 ensures eligible students with disabilities have equal access to education through the accomodations and supports of a Section 504 plan. Parents can request an evaluation in writing. If a student is found eligible and in need of accommodations, the 504 plan will list accommodations and supports the school will provide in order for the student to have access to an education. Examples are additional time for tests, note taking assistance, or other supports based on the needs of the student.
